RE: Mexico Tour

Dear Mexico-Bound Caravaneers:

We have been advised that you are planning to join the Wally Byam Caravan on a tour of Old Mexico and our assistance has been requested. It is with pleasure that we offer our services to you.

We understand that the Caravaneers will congregate at the El Rancho Grande Trailer Park located at 5314 Doniphan Drive here in El Paso, Texas, starting about January 10, and then the entire group will cross the Rio Grande River at the El Paso - Ciudad Juarez port of entry on Tuesday, January 15.

In order to make this International Border crossing as easy and as smooth as possible, may we recommend that as many of the formalities be taken care of in advance of your arrival at El Paso as is possible and convenient. We will try to be of every assistance in helping you accomplish this.

First, we highly recommend that you secure from your local AAA Motor Club the 224-page guidebook "Mexico by Motor". This excellent publication includes Customs and Immigration regulations, recommended accommodations and restaurants, describes all points of interest, describes road systems including elevations and mileages, automobile agencies, tips on touring to Mexico, Spanish-English vocabulary and many other subjects of importance to the tourist.

We urge you to carefully read the requirements for entry to Mexico both with regards to the individual and with the automobile and trailer. On page 13 in "Mexico by Motor" you will note that each person 15 years of age or older is required to secure a Mexican Tourist Card (cost is \$3.00 U. S. Currency). This you may secure in advance of arrival at the border by contacting your closest Mexican Consul. Proof of citizenship will be required.

Note on page 14 of the AAA guidebook that a car and trailer permit is required (issued gratis at the border) and it is necessary to carry proper proof of ownership of both vehicles.

On page 19 note the information under the heading of "Insurance". It is important that your car and trailer be properly insured with a reliable MEXICAN INSURANCE COMPANY for the period of time spent in Mexico. Mexican authorities do not recognize an insurance policy not registered in Mexico.

You may obtain recognized Mexican insurance for your car and trailer through authorized agents of the Ward Del Norte Insurance Agency located in the AAA building at 5036 E. Paisano Drive, El Paso, Texas.

In order to avoid any delay at the border due to the large number in the Caravan, the matter of insurance may be handled in advance. Enclosed please find information and rates for Mexican Insurance through the AAA approved La Provincial Insurance Company and Ward Del Norte Insurance Agency. (All Mexican insurance companies have identical rates and coverages determined by the Mexican Government). Enclosed also find an application for insurance. RETURN THE APPLICATION, PROPERLY FILLED OUT, TOGETHER WITH YOUR CHECK as soon as possible in order that your policy may be prepared by the agency in advance of your arrival. Please advise whether the policy should be mailed to you, held at the AAA office or forwarded to the El Rancho Grande Trailer Park pending your arrival in El Paso.

A smallpox vaccination certificate (issued within the last 3 years) may be required by the U. S. Public Health authorities upon your return to the U. S. If you do not have it, you may be subjected to a vaccination (gratis) at the border.

If you plan to take firearms, read the paragraph on page 14. Be certain to contact your closest Mexican Consulate in advance of your departure from home.

If you plan to import liquor to the U. S., it would be well to note your home state regulations found on page 15 of "Mexico by Motor". Texas now permits the importation of only one quart even though your home state may permit more.


Regarding Mexican money, sufficient currency for the first few days of the trip is obtainable at the AAA El Paso Office.

In the event your license plates will expire during your stay in Mexico, you should arrange to procure new plates from your home state and have them sent to the AAA office in El Paso, Laredo or Brownsville in Texas or Nogales, in Arizona, or in care of the U. S. Customs, Border Line Office, at the point of exit. It is not necessary to have them sent into Mexico.

Be assured that the AAA office in El Paso desires to help you in every possible way. Please call upon us if we can be of further assistance. Enclosed find a folder listing the services available.

We hope that your trip South-of-the-Border will be a most memorable one.
