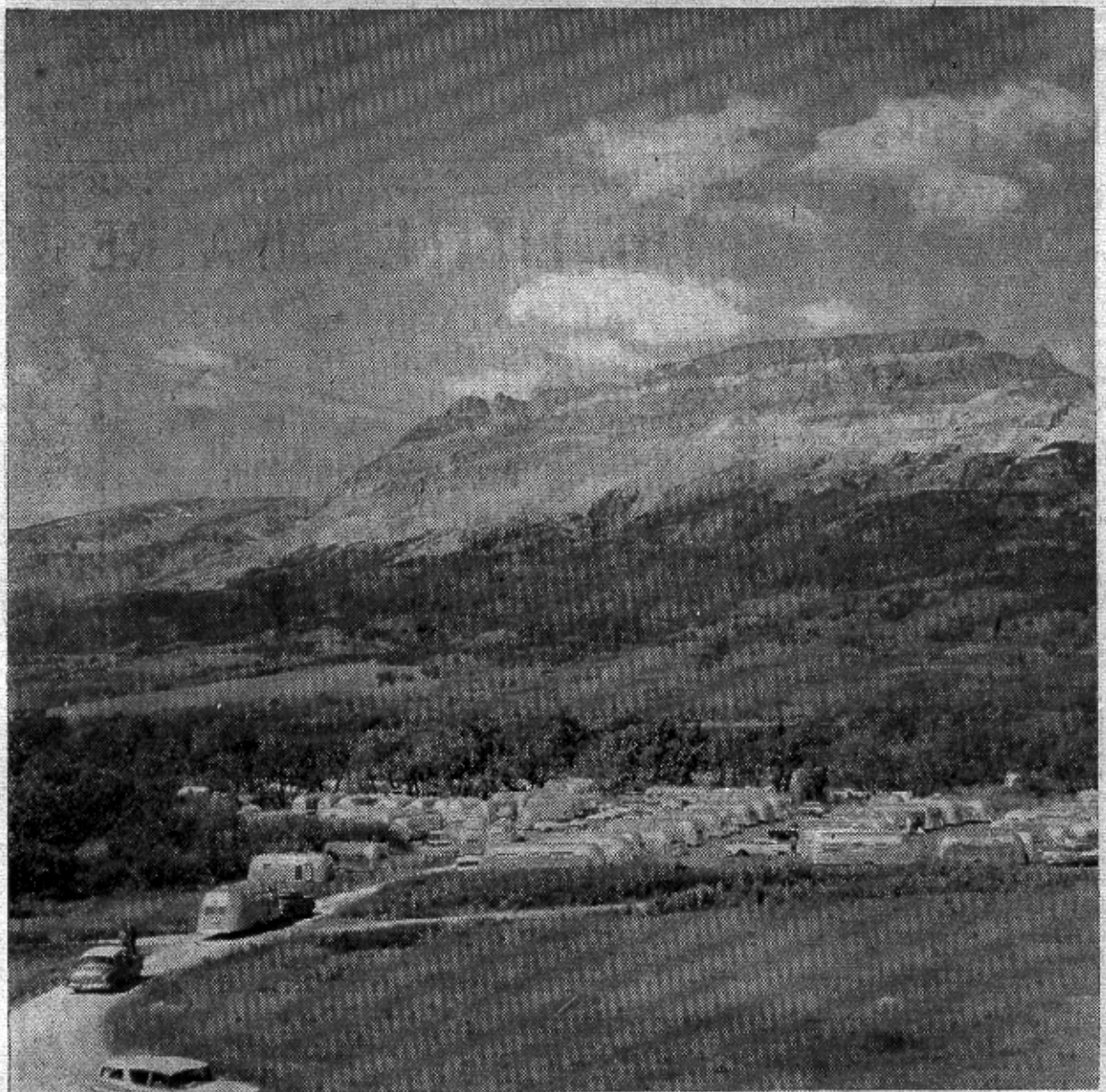
the afternoon with Mayor M. O. Gray bringing greetings from the city. Many of the Caravanners will ride the Clipper to the Ceremonial in the evening.

## Hansen Buys Cappy Store

Sale of Cappy's store in Wisconsin Dells to Morris Hansen, head of three department stores in Juneau and Vernon counties, was announced this week by George Cappy.

The local store will become a part of the Hansen group which also includes stores at Elroy, Mauston and Hillsboro. Mr. Hansen will take possession of the Cappy property about Sept. 1.

The new owner, originally from Minneapolis, opened his first Wisconsin store in Elroy in 1945. Three years later, he opened another store in Blair, followed by the acquisition of the Art Vieth clothing store in Mauston in May 1951. With an area operation in mind, Hansen disposed of the Blair store and purchased Wolf's store in Hillsboro in 1953.

Mr. Cappy operated his store here, the past 11 years. It was formerly known as Kremer and Fuchiek and has been recognized for many years as one of the leading department stores in the area. Cappy has not announced his future plans.

## Girl Killed In Motor Crash

Miss Jackie Bindley, 17, Milwaukee, was killed in a traffic accident on Sauk Co. Trunk Highway A about four miles southwest of Wisconsin Dells about one o'clock Saturday morning. She had been visiting friends in the area.

The girl met instant death, according to Sauk county authorities when the automobile of a Kenosha youth left the highway to go into the deep ditch, pinning her in the wreckage.

The 1956 Mercury owned and operated by Dale Lloyd Nichols, 19, Kenosha, was southbound towards the small bridge which crosses a stream near the William Nehring farm and not far from the road leading to the former Henry Ringling farm.

Mr. Nehring and Kenneth Hanson, both of whom heard the crash in their homes, were the first at the scene of the accident. They notified south-
