Huge International Rally Of Trailer Club Opens on Saturday at Fairgrounds

It's Rally Time for Wally Byam Caravaners at the Beltrami County Fairgrounds and by tonight it is expected 2,000 trailers will be in position for the International get-together which starts at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow.

Trailers have been pouring into Bemidji during the past week and now the fairgrounds is literally bulging at the seams with the "silver trailers" whose owners are dedicated to "following the sun."

Bob Smith, International president of the WBCC, says this will be the greatest gathering of Caravaners in the history of International Rallies. Last year 1,700 gathered at Auburn, Washington, and by tomorrow, Smith expects 2,500 may register in at the Bemidji rally site.

This means that Bemidji will be hosting more than 7,500 guests during the rally which will run through July 5.

Tomorrow's opening ceremony will feature welcoming speeches by James Hensel, mayor of Bemidji; John McKee, state senator; Les Hoganson, president of the Bemidji Chamber of Commerce; and Dick Turcotte, executive secretary of the C. of C.

Giving the response for the Caravaners will be the international president. Invocation and benediction will be given by Rev. Bennett Brudevold, president of the Minnesota Unit and pastor of the Aldersgate Methodist Church of Minneapolis.

A feature of the opening ceremony will be a parade of flags with flags of all nations, states and units on display. The flag raising will be conducted by the Explorer Boy Scouts of Bemidji with Darrel Lauderbaugh, leader. Music will be by the Bemidji high school band, Earl Kerns, director.

Bemidji Man Is Killed in Plunge Off Water Tower

Survivors include his parents, three sisters, Mrs. Lila Coe of Meade, Wash.; Mrs. Betty Peterson, Des Moines, Ia.; and Mrs. Ruth Ann Helgren, Bemidji; two brothers, Charles and Gerald of Bemidji.

Arrangements for funeral services in Bemidji have not been completed.

Nikita Agrees JFK Visit 'To Divide Berlin'

Berlin. (AP)—Soviet Premier Khrushchev arrived in East Berlin today and was told that President Kennedy's trip to West Berlin was made for the purpose of creating enmity among Germans. Khrushchev said he agreed.

He came for a summit meeting with leaders of Soviet bloc countries.

Walter Ulbricht, the spade-bearded East German Communist leader, greeted Khrushchev with a kiss and declared in a welcoming speech:

"Kennedy came to West Berlin to stir up the West German people against the people of East Germany in the interests of the West."

Kennedy Asks Small Nations Imitate Erin in Support of United Nations

Dublin (AP) — President Kennedy called on the small nations today to imitate Ireland's support of the United Nations as the surest guarantee of world peace.

To great applause and cheers, Kennedy addressed a joint session of the Dail—a parliament formed out of centuries of struggle.

The Dail opened its doors and its heart to the U. S. President, a great-grandson of an Irish immigrant. He was the first U. S. president ever to address the Dail.

The big powers alone are no certain guarantee for the success of the U. N.'s peacemaking efforts, the President said.

"The peacekeeping machinery of the United Nations cannot work without the help of small nations," Kennedy said in a half-hour speech.

"Great powers have their responsibilities and their burdens but the smaller nations of the world must fulfill their obligations as well."

After receiving the freedom of the City of Cork, Kennedy laid a wreath at the monument to 14 Irish patriots executed in the 1916 uprising against the British. Then he came to the Dail in Dublin.

After his speech, he went to Dublin Castle to accept honorary degrees from the National University and the University of Dublin, and the honorary citizenship of the City of Dublin.

Two Drown, 2 Killed in State Traffic

Two deaths by drowning and two in traffic accidents were reported in Minnesota today.

The auto deaths raised Minnesota's 1963 traffic accident toll to 314, or 53 above the total a year ago.

Mrs. Adelaide Reilly, 70, and her pet dog were killed when struck by a car as they were crossing a street near the woman's home in Edina, a Minneapolis suburb.

Edmund Benson, 66, Fargo, D. was killed and five other persons were injured in a collision of automobiles at a road intersection south of Dilworth.

The injured, hospitalized at Fargo, were Mrs. Benson and four occupants of the other car, all from Regina, Sask.: Mrs. Dan Bradley, 42; Mrs. Frank Laslo, 42; Mrs. Laslo's daughter, Geraldine, 20, and Gus Brandt, 5.

A La Crescent housewife on a swimming outing with her family and a little Blooming Prairie girl are Minnesota's latest drowning victims.

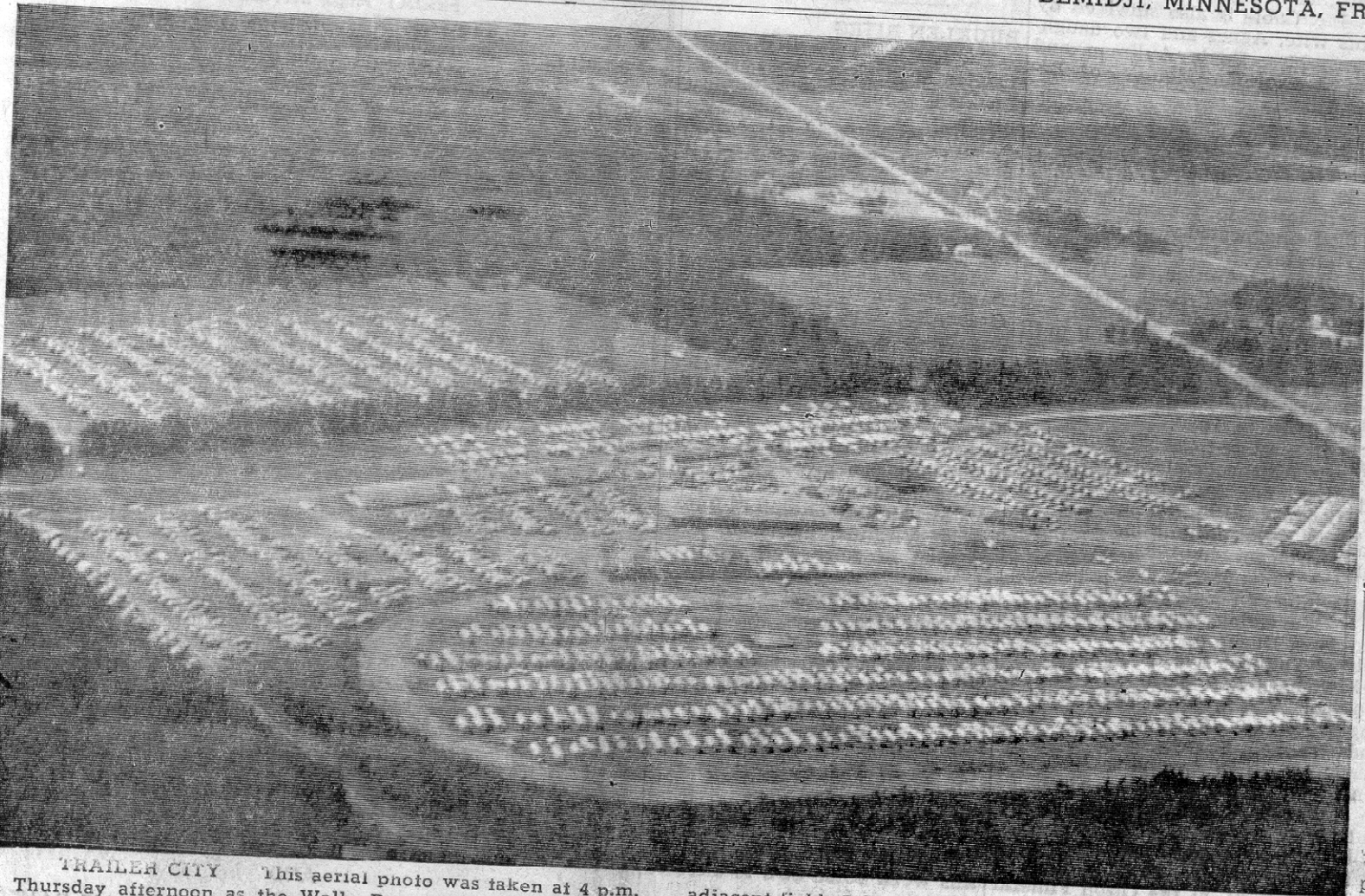

Traffic Toll Soars To New 5-Months High

Chicago — (AP)—The National Safety Council reported today that motor vehicle fatalities numbered 15,190 in the January-May period this year—a record for the first five months of any year.

“While the number of deaths increased 6 per cent in the five months,” the council reported, “the amount of travel increased only 4 per cent. The resulting death rate for the period was 4.8 fatalities per 100 million miles, up 2 per cent.”

May's toll of 3,650 soared 13 per cent above the tally in May 1962.

Increases have been marked up in 17 of the last 19 months.

Deaths averaged 100 per day between Jan. 1 and May 31.

Last year, when motor vehicle fatalities surged to a record 40,900, the heaviest losses of life were in June, July and August.

Big numerical factors have been the steady increases in the number of motor vehicles and the miles they roll up on the streets and roads.

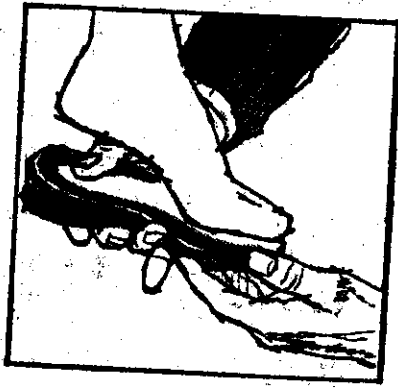
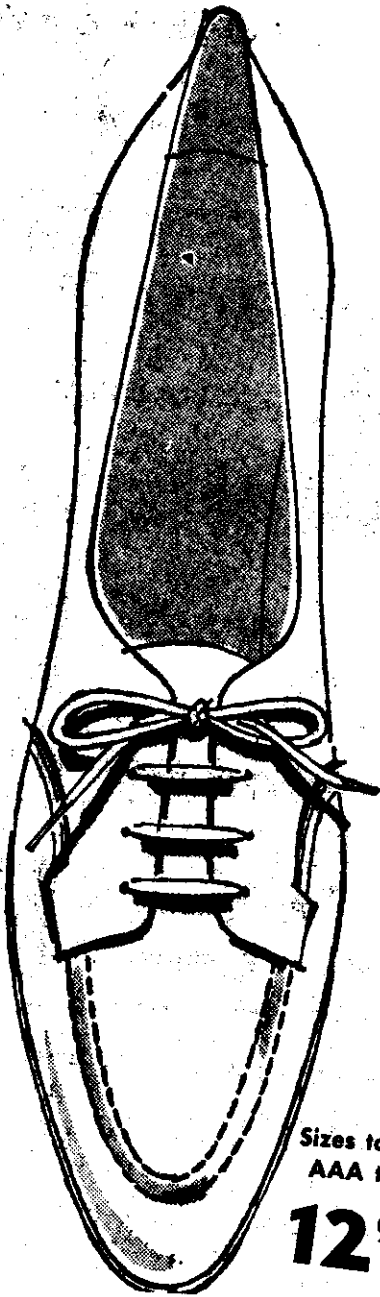
