Freedom

An article in the recent Blue Beret by the Membership Chair, WBCCI talked about the four freedoms Wally Byam envisioned for Airstream Owners. A discussion at our last SNU meeting prompted us to write a response. The SNU has gone through a lot of changes over the last year and we realized that those Freedoms were a part of why we made some of the changes we did and why we are proud of what the unit has accomplished so far. This is our response to the first Freedom mentioned in the article. To see this Freedom in action, join us at our April rally at Pyramid Lake.

Freedom from arrangements - The SNU is in the unique position of having lots of wide open space for Unit gatherings. Although we may have to reserve a site, we are usually free to park where we want and how we want. Since our membership prefers dry camping or minimal facilities, we have more options and are not dependent on high price campgrounds or RV parks. The open parking available to the SNU also means that we never have to turn away anyone, even if they haven't registered for the rally. One of the primary assets of the Airstream that Wally Byam promoted was that it is self contained and can have all the comforts of home independent of provided services. The SNU follows that example on most of our outings.

We also have a flexible rally schedule, and side trips, activities, and tours, are optional. The SNU provides a list of possibilities available for each rally but arrangements are made by the individuals not the SNU. This enables members the freedom to make their own arrangements, to come when they can, for as long as they can, and participate or not participate as they choose.




Pyramid Lake Rally - Location: Northeast of Reno about fifty miles, just north of Sutcliffe. From Reno/Sparks take the Pyramid Lake Highway route 445 North. From I80 east of Reno take route 447 towards Nixon and then route 446 to merge with route 445 going North. The preferred Camp spot is near the Pelican Point boat launch about 3 miles north of Sutcliffe. While route 445 is paved, the 'road' to the beach goes from gravel to trail in the sand. Facilities: dump station at the RV park and marina just north of Sutcliffe. Look for Airstreams on the beach just south of the Pelican Point boat launch. If you want the amenities, there is a full service RV park in Sutcliffe just a few miles south on route 445. You could park there and join us by commuting. Rally fee: \$20 to help with miscellaneous supplies, coffee, or whatever.

Pay the Indians at the station near the entrance to the reservation when coming up from Reno on route 445 or at the Sutcliffe Marina near the RV park on the north side of Sutcliffe. Last year it was \$5 per night. Events and activities: The unit meeting is scheduled for Saturday at about 1 p.m. Morning coffee klatch is from about 7 to 9 on Saturday and Sunday. Happy hours will likely occur on Friday and Saturday starting about 5 p.m. On Saturday we'd like to gather for a potluck dinner about 6 p.m. All gatherings will be informal and BYO (bring your own) to share as suits your karma. If you want to coordinate and plan, then form your own conspiracy with whomever is handy!
