Gatsby Festival The SNU has been asked to participate in the September 17, 2005 Gatsby Festival. The Festival is an annual event sponsored jointly by The Tahoe Heritage Foundation and the USDA Forest Service at the Tallac Historic Site in South Lake Tahoe, California. There is a 2 day event in August and a 1 day event in September. The event celebrates the time period between World War I and World War II. Activities include tours of the Pope house given by costumed guides, antique cars, entertainment, children's games, contests, vendors with vintage wares and the highlight - The Great Gatsby Tea. Airstreamers on the Road



We have met a number of interesting Airstreamers on the road in our travels, so we have decided to add a new section to the newsletter called "Airstreamers on the Road". We should have done this years ago, since there are so many interesting Airstreamers out there.

We met Lewis and Catherine Fink at Buckskin Mountain State Park north of Parker, AZ. in March. They were driving a 1978 Suburban towing a 1984 29 foot Airstream Sovereign. They are from Redmond, Washington, and have been traveling in their Airstream since they bought it new in 1984. The truck and trailer have over 200,000 miles on them, including eight trips to Baja, California, and a trip to Alaska. Since it was new, they have replaced the refrigerator which was a defective model, replaced the shocks, and installed new curtains all around. They have also refinished all of the woodwork. To improve the trailer they installed two solar panels, added a vented catalytic heater installed in the front lounge area to take the chill out of those cool nights. The front window shields were not standard that year, so they had those installed at purchase.

The refrigerator failed for the third or fourth time when they stopped over night in Chicken, Alaska, along the "Top of the World Highway" to Dawson Creek, Yukon Territory. The Dometic dealer in Anchorage, Alaska replaced it for them after telling them it was a defective model. It was flown in as cargo on an Air Alaska flight which did not have a full load of passengers.

They are celebrating Lewis's 90th birthday and their 60th wedding anniversary this year. They say this may be their last trip since their children want them to stay home. If they do stay home, their rig will be for sale. Their telephone number is 425-883-0085 if anyone is interested. Of course they won't be home for a while as they were on their way to Yuma.
