## Last Northern SNU Rally of 2008


Thursday October 16 – Sunday 19, 2008 the SNU will hold it's last regular rally for 2008 at Blue Lakes dispersed camping area off Hwy 88 in Hope Valley. From Reno, take 395 south to SR88. Follow SR88 thru Woodfords into Hope Valley. Continue past the Meyers turnoff. (Hwy 89) Go about 3 or 4 miles to the Blue Lakes road. Make a left on Blue Lakes road. The first set of camping areas is only 1/10 of a mile on your right behind the outhouse there are spaces under the trees. To the left is an open meadow. The rally site



is a nice gravel area, near a large pond and surrounded by meadows and mountains. Melissa says once you turn on Blue Lakes road, there is no way you can miss the rally site.
