Off Grid-camping will set you free!

SNU rallies are the perfect introduction to off-grid camping. We have dealt with a variety of issues at SNU dry-camping rallies including batteries that ran flat, water systems that sprung a leak or weren't functioning in the first place and flaky refrigerators. Some members enjoy watching TV or movies at night. Some like to use a lot of water for showers or other washing. One member, for medical reasons needed to run a generator all night. They parked in such a way that it didn't impact others. With a little care and caution, we run air conditioners to keep us cool and heaters to keep us warm. Even the newer Airstreams with their controller boards and alarms that use some residual power do just fine drycamping as long as you pay attention. Dry-camping means adapting some of the things you do at home or at a full service site to accommodate more limited resources. To make the propane go a little further, keep the heater a little lower or use a catalytic heater. BBQ instead of using the stove and oven. Batteries go a little further if you limit the use of battery draining equipment. Consider other power sources like solar or generators to augment your on board systems. Water having enough and disposing of it properly, makes an impact on your enjoyment of dry-camping. With a little planning and consideration you can be totally comfortable while minimizing the amount of water you use. SNU members have utilized a variety of commercial as well as other methods for handling gray water if the tank starts to get full. Keep in mind, dry-camping is it is a state of mind. Dry-camping is not about doing without. It is thinking about what you do, the systems you use and how to use these systems most effectively and efficiently. The most important asset to dry-camping with the SNU is the experience of our members. There is always somebody at an SNU rally who can assist with any problems that might arise including charging batteries, sharing extra water or propane, or providing refrigerator space. We usually have a fair supply of tools and have frequently done a little repair and maintenance work on various Airstreams at rallies. After learning to enjoy dry-camping SNU style, you'll have a lot more options of places to visit and things to enjoy. Check the link in this newsletter for more information on dry-camping SNU style. Sierra Nevada Unit Business Meeting

SNU President, Dyann called the meeting to order and began with discussion of the upcoming October 2011 Region 12 Rally in Jackson CA and the Wally Byam Birthday rally in July in Baker, OR. Dyann handed out flyers for both of these rallies and encouraged everyone to attend. Dyann then asked Bryan to share an idea for the SNU 35th anniversary rally in South Lake Tahoe. Bryan said the SNU has a healthy bank balance and a way to celebrate would be for the SNU to cover a lot of the costs involved of this event. What this means is that participants would pay the usual SNU rally fee of \$5 per night for the rally and \$15 per person for the dinner cruise and the SNU would pick up the rest of the costs. All SNU members at El Charro approved of this plan. Dyann then asked Randy to discuss the rally plans for the 35th Anniversary rally at South Lake Tahoe. Randy has been working on this event for several months. Over an extended period of time he has tried numerous methods of communication with the event coordinator for the Zephyr Cove RV Park including a site visit, email and phone. The apparent disinterest and lack of response by Zephyr Cove has made planning extremely difficult and caused serious concerns about follow through. Randy also contacted Campground By the Lake just west of downtown South Lake Tahoe. Initial communications have been much more promising. Randy handed out a sheet describing the pros and cons of both options. After reviewing these options and some discussion, the group voted on holding the rally at Campground By The Lake with a dinner cruise on the Tahoe Queen. The meeting adjourned after some general discussion.

We finally made it to our first Rose Parade Rally this year, and are so glad we did. About 25 rigs gathered a few blocks off of Colorado Blvd in a school yard and the fun began. Airstreamers traveled from as far as Tennessee, Texas and Eastern Canada. We had a large tent where we shared several meals and fellowship. The tent was filled with music, dancing and more food as 2010 wound down and the calendar turned over to 2011. The rally was well planned and executed. Hats off to Ken and Judy Bechtold and all involved. As with any event like this, many people work very hard to make it such a success. We had plenty of time to enjoy the area attractions; museums, lovely neighborhood tours, float building tours and after the parade, the up-close-and-personal encounter with the floats.
