SOURDOUGH PANCAKE/WAFFLE RECIPE

Jeni asked your editor to disclose his "secret" recipe for sourdough pancakes and waffles; it's relatively simple:

- •Two Cups of active Sourdough Starter (or ~460 grams)
- •1 egg
- •4 tablespoons oil
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- •1/2 teaspoon salt
- •1 scant teaspoon baking soda
- •1 tablespoon warm water

Use a whisk to blend the egg, oil, water and dry ingredients together. Place the sourdough in a large bowl and fold in the blended ingredients using a spurtle or large spatula. Ladle the batter on to a lightly greased skillet or waffle maker and fry/cook to desired doneness.

Don's somewhat "secret" recipe can be found in <u>Alaska Sourdough</u> by Ruth Allman 1976.

The real secret or work is making the sourdough and keeping it active. It requires that you create or obtain a small sample of sourdough starter, either from a commercial source or from someone. You'll need to make something with your starter every week, waste some and feed or refrigerate it to maintain your starter. Follow the directions from the source or use the instructions on the King Arthur Flour website: kingarthurbaking.com/recipes/feeding-and-maintaining-your-sourdough-starter-recipe.

I began with sourdough in 2012 after reading about miners and people living off the grid in Alaska. We have taken it to every rally and caravan since. Hold a class on Sourdough at our October Anniversary Rally; I'll even bring starter samples for you to create your own starter.

AIRSTREAM TRAVEL HINTS from Our President, Jeni Root

Refrigerator/freezer tips for traveling:

- As you might notice, I'm all about the ice; we run the refrigerator on propane when traveling (disclaimer our tip, not anyone else's). We still have problems keeping the pilot lit, but hear there's a great solution by cutting a furnace filter to size we'll get back to you on this. *<Not a problem on later model Airstreams with an automatic igniter or the very new models with a DC 12v refrigerator editor>*
- We put ice in a ziplock, which goes in a hard plastic container, and place a piece of brown paper bag (about 3x5 inches) to absorb the moisture. If the ice melts and refreezes together a little, no problem just lightly drop the bag of ice on the counter and your ice is a good as new.

•Use covered ice trays for making more ice - there's nothing worse than water splashing in the freezer, and hardening, while traveling! Lesson learned!

•Freeze empty Gatorade and apple juice size containers ahead of travel. We use these to stock the freezer and refrigerator when traveling - and if/when they melt, we have ice cold water to drink!

•Pre-pack ice in our cycling water bottles. An easy place to store more ice without a chance of leaking if something goes wrong.

•The more cold items in the frig/freezer, the colder it stays (i.e. less energy needed).

•Put a few towels in the shelves to help keep items from shifting when traveling light.

•We use curtain tension rods to ensure everything stays on its shelf.

Eggs, learned the hard way on this one, too!



•I keep a carton with an internal second lid so the eggs won't bounce around too much. <editor's wife uses a plastic snaplock egg tray and place it in the back of the refrigerator under the metal fins.>

•If the road is really bumpy, I will grab the eggs and carry them in my lap.

•I've also broken the eggshells and put the eggs in a ketchup-type dispenser. Mine is marked every inch or so to indicate 1 egg, 2 eggs, etc. Great solution if you aren't going for 'sunny side up' style!

•We keep a small roll of heavy duty double stick tape - it's been used to keep a door shelf in place when a piece broke. <*Might be a better idea than the editor's aluminum and duct tape fix.>*

Just to recap our Airstream repairs for our solo caravan to Weed Heights; last year our fresh water tank began leaking when filled up over 75%. I was able to drop the tank, find the leaking fittings in the tank and get them replaced.

Tank cleaned up with new fittings spun-welded in, connections made and installed in the exterior plastic shell and ready to bolt up under the trailer.


