May Fort Churchill Rally

The Sierra Nevada Unit will host its May Fort Churchill Rally in two weeks, Thursday May 16th through Sunday the 19th at the Historic Fort Churchill State Park. Didn't make it out to Rye Patch or Weed heights in April, here's your chance for an early season Rally with moderate temperatures and only an hour from Reno (50 miles). Fort Churchill offers us the opportunity to visit the historic ruins, walk along the Carson River to fish or view wildlife and make a Saturday visit to Buckland Station. Want more exercise, bring your bicycles to tour a wider range of the area than those on two feet.

The Nevada state park website says about nearby Buckland Station, "Built in 1870 from materials from Fort Churchill, an army base that was abandoned in 1869, Buckland Station was a Pony Express stop, a supplier for western emigrants, a boarding house and a home for the Buckland family until 1885."

Did I mention our evening shared meals and potluck dinners, we'll have those too! The weather should be comfortable, it will likely be mid 80s in the daytime (we'll have shade); mid to upper 50s at night so no worries about heat or cold! Find us in the Samuel Buckland's Campground past the Fort ruins on the west side of US-95. Come out and camp or visit with us even if you can't stay the whole



weekend.

Note, we have always rallied at Nevada state park and recreation area campgrounds using the first come first served method for finding campsites. This will be our first experience since Nevada implemented their new reservation system. fourteen of the twenty campsites in the



Samuel Buckland Campground are available as of this writing; however you may choose to use reservenevada.com to secure a campsite in advance at *reservenevada.com*.

2024 Rally Season

June 20 -23: Crocker-Beckwourth Rally

Crocker is a National Forest Service campground located east of Lake Davis at 5800 ft. Situated next to a big meadow w/ancient lava flows, the small campground hugs a wooded hillside at the end of Beckwourth-Genesse Road.

July 22 - 26: Glass Creek Rally

Glass Creek is located halfway between June Lake and Mammoth Lakes, California. Hiking and OHV trails, forest roads and scenic highways provide opportunity to visit Crowley, June, Mammoth and Mono Lakes, Devil's Post Pile National Monument, Inyo Craters and scenic viewpoints. Too tired, the pine forest surrounds the campground so find a shady spot and catch some ZZZ's.

August 15 - 18: Taylorsville Rally

Taylorsville is a new location for the Sierra Nevada Unit, reported to be a quiet place to camp between Quincy & Greenville. Taylorsville Camprgound is across the street from the rodeo grounds and along Indian Creek; it has a tennis court, pickleball court, coin-operated showers, modern restrooms, and a RV sewer dump station. Plan to make this new for SNU rally.

September 11 - 15: Region 12 Lake Tahoe Rally

In case you glossed over some of the Region 12 emails and Facebook posts, the Region Rally has been moved from the Tri-County Fairground in Bishop, CA to Tahoe Valley Campground in the city of the same name. Water, electric, lack of sewer or dump stations and other onsite facilities didn't support the number of people attending the Region 12 rallies. Tahoe Valley has full hookups at each site, exercise and recreation on the grounds and a wealth of tourist attractions throughout the area; look for more detail and registration in April or May.

September 16 - 19: Hope Valley Rally

Hope Valley dispersed area is located on CA-88, 1.5 miles west of CA-89 and Picketts Junction. Campsites are is interspersed through the scenic meadows and forested lands at almost 7000 feet elevation.

October 67th WBCCI International Rally Sedalia, MO

2024 is the year to catch an International Rally at one of the most historical fairgrounds in the country, Oct 5th - 11th. We'll be gathering in immaculately kept buildings dating back as early as 1903 while also enjoying some of the Missouri State Fairgrounds newer buildings and modern installations. There is beauty in the mix of the old and new, just like all of us when We Rally Together! Sites are still available; make your reservation, <u>Register Here</u>.

October 17 - 20: SNU Anniversary Rally Walker River State Park

The Sierra Nevada Unit will celebrate its 48th anniversary at Walker River State Park's Quail Run Campground. Walker River is one of Nevada's newest state park; it includes several large ranches that had been closed to public access for more than 100 years that afford a vibrant outdoor experience that no other single Nevada State Park can provide. Plan to join us and celebrate the SNU's anniversary.

Needless to say, that's as far as we made it. The great horned owls were enormous and we're pretty sure they were protecting some young behind mama's flared wing. Four others were able to kayak out and

Fire Starters

The quest for easy, reliable, and effective fire starters was in full swing at Rye Patch during our April 2024 rally.

First, let's talk fire basics. Whether you build a tepee or log

cabin, you need tinder (fire starting material), some kindling (more than starter, less than a log, creating heat and coals), and then progressively larger sizes of dry wood. There are seasoned/aged wood from home, left over 2x4's from construction sites, and/or wood from the campsite (purchased or if allowed, gathered). You'll need a flame and oxygen.

Often, newspaper, pine needles, pine cones, twigs, and split 2x4s contributed to getting that guintessential camp fire started. The problems with these are they can be messy, the flame goes out with a certain light breeze, or not enough starter to begin with. Smoky start, try again.

Somewhere along the line, I started making toilet paper roll starters. These rolls were filled/stuffed with dryer lint - and considering Brian is a finish carpenter, I can attest the lint was "good stuff"! The starters were a little slow to start, I probably pack them a little too tight, hence not enough oxygen. They burned ok, but I can't say I would ever get a rip-roaring fire going with just one of these.

Enter this year's competitors: Egg carton catch-alls and baby oil cotton balls.

The egg carton catch-alls are just that: a little dryer lint, a little melted wax, and a few drops of baby oil. Some people suggest separating each egg, I was lazy and kept 2 eggs

together for each starter. The carton lit easily and stayed burning - great solution and I'll continue to make these (instead of paper towel starters).

Baby oil cotton balls are just that: a travel size baby oil container, poured onto 2.5 cup plastic container full of cotton balls. Squished around so each ball had oil. I'd say the



container was packed, but not "stuffed". THIS IS THE WINNER! These little cotton balls are easy peasy, stay lit for a LONG time, travel well, and smell good! Internet research suggested other oils may work, but baby oil is the best. I'll always have a container in the airstream for future trips!

With both egg carton and cotton balls, we didn't really use any other kindling of consequence and both resulted in raging fires with little effort. I think the second night we started the fire with 3 cotton balls...and voila, camping atmosphere complete.

many pop tabs as you can from rallies, home, work and even your neighbors. You can bring them to the International Rally in Sedalia, MO.


